Rescued from neglect, in search of my forever home Juliet

I am Juliet, at least that's what they call me at the horse rescue. No one knows my real name or if I was even given one. I was born into a herd of lovely Pintabians (Arabian crosses with pinto coloring) in Fremont County, Colorado sometime in 2004. No one knows my exact birth date. My herd was not cared for by their human. We were hungry and thirsty, some of us were sick. We had no veterinary care, no dental care, no hoof care, poor nutrition, and no handling or training. Some of my herd died before rescuers could save us. I was lucky. I was in good enough shape to recover from these unfortunate beginnings, many of my herd mates weren't and had to be humanely euthanized. I was brought to *Ruby Ranch Horse Rescue* where I met humans who treated me kindly, gave me food, and provided all the care I ever needed. Some months after arriving there veterinarians told me and my humans that I was pregnant. On March 28, 2010 my little baby, Tallula was born. I was a good mom but Tallula was so sick. My humans tried everything to help her but couldn't save her. On April 13, 2010, I had to say goodbye to Tallula as she took her last breath. I miss her, but have taken comfort from my friend, another rescued horse from my herd, Raina. On May 9, 2010, I said goodbye to Raina to begin another leg of my journey towards finding a permanent family. I was transported to *Deseos Arabians & Miniatures* where I will learn the things I need to know for riding and being someone's horse. There are other horses here, some of them are Arabians, some are from rescues, and two are even from my old herd. Here I will learn to lunge, be saddled & bridled, and how to safely carry a rider. It is scary and upsetting to be moved yet again, but they are kind here and I find comfort in the other horses. I will just be happy to someday find a person to be my very own, and a family to be a permanent part of. I want to find my forever home where I will never have to leave or be separated from my friends. In the mean time I will be here with Lori and Jim where I will learn how to be a partner for the special human that I know is out there looking for me. If you are considering adoption and would like to visit with me make an appointment with Lori and she will introduce us. I am very sweet, smart, willing to trust humans, and eager to learn!
